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Mentoring and Guiding Clinical Fellows, Student Clinicians, and SLPAs: Safeguarding Professional Values

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Sponsored by West End SELPA

Clinicians are often thrust into the role of supervisor with little or no training in the knowledge and skills required for effective supervision. Lacking formal preparation for the supervisory process, many professionals fall back on the methods modeled by their own former supervisors. In doing so, they operate without benefit of the knowledge available in the current literature.

Part I: Participants will examine supervision as a discipline, and will gain an understanding of the essential elements of effective supervision, clinical instruction, and mentoring, and will include a discussion of the ethical and legal requirements of supervision. Further, the workshop will address supervisory decision-making based on specific tools for assessing the knowledge and skills of the supervisee.

Outcomes: Participants will be able to:

1. Define and discuss the essential elements of effective supervision;
2. Discuss the critical effects of communication styles and personality on the supervisory relationship;
3. Describe methods for assessing the knowledge and skills of the supervisee.

Part II: This interactive workshop, participants will examine communication styles that may affect the ability to work effectively with mentees. Participants will also discuss events and trends that shape generations, and will address behavior and value differences between today's young professionals and those who supervise, teach, and mentor them.

Outcomes: Participants will be able to:

1. Discuss the events and trends that shape critical values and behavioral differences between generations;
2. Describe values differences between generations and discuss the implications for supervision, mentoring, and clinical instruction;
3. Describe how generational diversity enriches the profession.
